The Forum in Venice have been characterized by the interactive dialogue and have addressed a wide range of topics and issues, including Net neutrality, Cybersecurity, Industry 4.0, the Internet of Things, Digital divide, Internet Rights and Internet governance.

Previous editions of IGF Italy have shown the value of multi-stakeholder approach and the importance of including the different social actors - government, institutions and public administrations, private sector, research and civil society - that bring points of view, needs and equally different experiences with each other.

The Venice Forum has been an opportunity to facilitate the exchange of ideas, information and best practices at national level; the results of work will be presented by Stefano Trumpy (Internet Society Italy Chapter President) at the next global IGF to be held in Zapopan, Guadalajara Metropolitan Area 6 to 9 December, hosted by the Mexican government.

General organizational aspects of IGF Italy

Italy promptly responded to the recommendation of January 2008 of the European Parliament to start organizing a regional IGF (that was named Euro Dialog forum on Internet Governance) and national IGFS.

IGF Italy started to adopt a nomadic model (like EuroDIG) and in each year a local host has been engaged in several aspects of the organization, including finding sponsors for covering the expenses that have been normally maintained in a few tenths of kilo Euro, considering that, in most of the cases, the

location was offered pro bono. There has not been up to now a formally recognized organization for IGF Italy but a small set of voluntary contributors supplied needs to organize yearly meetings. Internet Society Italia Chapter started the process IGF in Italy and has been constantly involved in the organizations of all editions: Cagliari, Pisa, Roma (3 editions) Trento, Torino, and Venetia this year. In order to discuss the preparation and themes to be included in the programme we relied on an email forum to give advise for yearly editions. For Venezia we decided to have a two days meeting, after single day meetings held in Chamber of Deputies in Roma in 2014 and 2015.

Achievements

An attendance of about 170 participants assured a proactive interaction in all sessions; over 50 attendants from stakeholders groups had the opportunity to express their views, following IGF model. The technical community has been very well represented as well as the private sector, ranging from the big companies, like Google and Cisco and a representation of small companies and startups. Civil society has been also represented and government has been represented by a few high level officials.

Particular interest has been focused on Internet rights, as a follow on of the Declaration of Internet Rights prepared at the Chamber of Deputies in July 2015 by a committee composed of MPs and members representing stakeholders. The value of the Declaration is not only for internal use in Italy but is a model that gained attention not only in Europe, but in the global scene. Internet Rights Declaration raises issues that have interested several thematic sessions in Venezia, if not all.

An other critical issue has been the constitution in Italy of a multi-stakeholder structure to manage the Internet; IGF Italy, already in last year edition, collected opinions of stakeholder groups and elaborated a motion to the government to create a structure following the well known Brazilian model or more recent models like those implemented in U.K. or France. In this year edition, the undersecretary of Economic Development Ministry in charge of communications, assured in a registered intervention, that it is time to concretize and non governmental stakeholder present in Venezia have been invited to prepare an agreed proposal to be addressed to the Presidency of Council of Ministers.

All thematic sessions attracted sensible attention and, after an adequate reporting, will get the possibility to continue the discussions in order to assure that the work continues intercessional, before setting up next year IGF Italy edition.
