Background of Internet Governance Discourse in Nepal


Internet Society Nepal Chapter, Forum for Digital Equality and the High-Level Commission on Information Technology conducted the first formal discussion on Internet Governance in 27th November 2008, just before the Hyderabad IGF. Various government bodies, organizations, associations and agencies have been involved in IG discussion at different names and forms.

Right before Prig 2016, some of major stakeholders (DoIT, ISOC Nepal, FDE, ISPAN and IOE) had a meeting at Department of Information Technology on conducting a full stakeholder's meeting for wider consultation. An informal meeting with IGF MAG Chair Lynn St. Amour, and NRI's focal Anja Genjo was held during ICANN 57 [5th November 2016] in Hyderabad, India. Mr. Subhash Dhakal, Director of Department of Information Technology, Mr. Babu Ram Aryal, President of Forum for Digital Equality, Mr. Bikram Shrestha, President of ISOC Nepal Chapter and Mr. Suman Lal Pradhan, President of ISP Association of Nepal were part of the meeting and discussed the fundamental principles of IGF and strategies on forming national IGFs.

After a series of background discussions and workout, after almost 8 years finally a stakeholder's meeting was held on 21st February 2017 at Department of Information Technology and adopted Declaration of Nepal IGF and Standard Operating Procedure of Multi-Stakeholder Steering Group (MSG). The meeting also formed first Ad Hoc MSG and the leaders of MSG.

Formation of Nepal IGF

Nepal IGF declaration was signed on Feb 21, 2017 in an event at Department of Information Technology, Government of Nepal, Thapagaun, Kathmandu, Nepal. The declaration was signed by 23 person from Six different stakeholder group.

Mandate of the IGF

- Discuss public policy issues related to key elements of Internet governance in order to foster the sustainability, robustness, security, stability and development of the Internet.
- Facilitate discourse between bodies dealing with different cross-cutting international public policies regarding the Internet and discuss issues that do not fall within the scope of any existing body.
- Interface with appropriate inter-governmental organizations and other institutions on matters under their purview.
- Facilitate the exchange of information and best practices, and in this regard make full use of the expertise of the academic, scientific and technical communities.
- Advise all stakeholders in proposing ways and means to accelerate the availability and affordability of the Internet in the developing world.
- Strengthen and enhance the engagement of stakeholders in existing and/or future Internet governance mechanisms, particularly those from developing countries.
- Identify emerging issues, bring them to the attention of the relevant bodies and the public, and, where appropriate, make recommendations.
- Contribute to capacity building for Internet governance in developing countries, drawing fully on local sources of knowledge and expertise.
- Promote and assess, on an ongoing basis, the embodiment of SWISS principles in Internet governance processes.
- Discuss, inter alia, issues relating to critical Internet resources.
- Help to find solutions to the issues arising from the use and misuse of the Internet, of concern to everyday users.
- Publish its proceedings.

Objectives of the Nepal IGF

- To promote and encourage open and inclusive dialogue and exchange of ideas among all stakeholders involved with Internet governance related issues in Nepal.
- To support and ensure the proper conduct of the organizational work of the annual Nepal IGF,
- To act as an interface among Nepal IGF Community, the Asia Pacific IGF community and the global IGF community.

- To Create opportunities to share best practices and experiences; identify emerging issues and bring them to the attention of the relevant bodies and the public;
- To Contribute to capacity building for Internet governance.
- To raise awareness, build capacity and promote a better understanding of Internet governance-related matters among the stakeholders of their respective community;
- To facilitate a multi-stakeholder discussion and exchanges of ideas and opinions. They should seek to foster multi-stakeholder collaboration among the stakeholders from their respective community; and
- To bring the perspectives of the respective community to the global IGF agenda and vice-versa.

The Forum

The first Nepal Internet Governance Forum, Nepal IGF 2017, was held in Kathmandu from 18 to 19 August 2017. Over 150 industry leaders, government representatives, academics, students, and Internet users attended the event hosted by the Nepal Internet Society Nepal with support from the government as well as other national and international organizations. The forum sought to facilitate inclusive and productive discussions on Internet-related public policy issues related to “Building Sustainable Internet Ecosystem in Nepal”.



The topics covered in the forum included Internet of Things (IoT) and smart cities, Cybersecurity, Internet infrastructure and access, IPv6 adoption, Digital inclusion and human rights and Management of country code top level domain (.np).
